Kids Market Guidelines

I. Participation

- Children must be 17 years old or younger.
- Children may sell any items they create, including homemade arts and crafts, treats, or retail items. They may set their own prices. Selling live animals or commercial goods on behalf of parents is not allowed.
- All sales must occur within the assigned booth space; roving sales are prohibited.
- Children must arrive, check in, and set up at least 30 minutes before the market begins.
- At the end of the event, children are responsible for cleaning their booth area. Large items, such as boxes, should be placed in the dumpster on the south side of the KOPFC parking lot.

II. Booths

- Registration: All children must register for a booth online prior to the event. No day-of stand-by booths will be allowed.
- Booth Policy: No refunds will be given, and booths may not be sold or transferred without KOPFC approval. All items must be pre-approved and waivers signed.
- Weather: The event will proceed regardless of weather conditions. (Fingers crossed for sunshine!)
- Booth Size: Each booth is a 10' x 10' space on grass.
- Supplies: Children must bring their own table, chairs, price signs, money box with change, and a canopy (optional; maximum size 10' x 10'). If electricity was requested, please bring a heavy-duty extension cord (100' recommended). Limited electricity is available.
- Booth Assignments: All booths are preassigned. A map with booth names and numbers will be provided online before the event.
- Booth locations on the grass will be marked in advance.

III. Parents / Adults

- Parking: After unloading vehicles, please park in the south parking lot.
- Role During Sales: Parents may help their children answer questions and count money, but may not conduct the sales. This event is designed for children to learn and take the lead.
- Supplies: Please bring water and snacks for your children.
- Item Restrictions: Children may not sell Multi-level marketing products or live animals on behalf of parents. If a child is found selling such items, their booth may be shut down with no refund. All items must be made and sold by the child.
- Sales Tax Compliance: The parent signer will receive a Special Event Sales Tax Collection Form by mail for their child.
- As the signer, you are responsible for assisting your child with tax collection, completing the form, and submitting it as needed. For a one-time event, you may indicate “one-time event” and \$0 on the form. The form must be submitted to the Utah State Tax Commission within 10 days after the event. Failure to submit may result in contact from the commission regarding delinquent taxes. - In compliance with legal requirements, the event promoter must collect the name, address, Social Security number or tax ID number for each vendor, regardless of filing status. IV. Food Items

- Low-Risk On-Site Foods: Children may sell and make low-risk items on-site, such as cotton candy, snow cones, or lemonade. No additional food permits are required, but obtaining one is highly recommended.
- Prohibited On-Site Foods: Preparing and selling food on-site, such as hamburgers, hotdogs or raw meat items, is not allowed.

Off-Site Foods:

- Children selling food items made off-site must comply with the Homemade Food Act, including posting a sign stating the food is “not regulated.”
- Regulations and sample signs can be found on our website, and signs will also be available at check-in.
- If your items contain meat, only homegrown chickens and rabbits may be used. Beef and pork are prohibited under the Home-made Food Act.
- Vendors with a Cottage Food Permit or a permit from a county health department are exempt from these restrictions.
